".. they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." (Matt 1:23b)

What's in a name? Not many of us know the meaning of our name. I presume that most of us haven't given it much thought. We are so used to our name that we have never really taken the time to find out what our name means or where it came from. Some people are named after their ancestors or named after friends or famous people. Some names are made up and have little to no reference to anyone at all.

Choosing the name for a child is one of the most important things that parents can do for a child. Our names are our legacy, and our names define us in many ways. For instance, Mark means defender or conqueror or warlike. I am not sure about warlike, but I do tend to be the defender of the downtrodden so in some ways my name defines me.

When Mary and Joseph were given the news of Jesus birth, I would imagine they began to think about names for this child, however that task was already done for them by God through the angel when Gabriel said "name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us."

On the surface this name may not seem that important, but as we contemplate the coming of Jesus into the world and all that this birth entails,

we begin to understand just how important this name Emmanuel is to the world.

Not only is Jesus God's promised Messiah, "Emmanuel, God with us", this is the very thing the world had been waiting for since the beginning of time. Ever since humanities fall from grace and its separation from the creator, God has been acting in mighty ways to reconcile the creation with the creator.

This name is more than just a promise that we will someday have a relationship with God, the name, given to this very special baby, is the fulfillment of that promise. This is God coming to be one of us in order to heal the rift humanity has been cultivating for thousands of years. "Emmanuel, God with us" is the creator God coming to us out of love for us.
