Stor's What is *"All Saints' Sunday"* all about?

Each year we celebrate All Saints' Day on the first Sunday in November. Why do we do this, and what are we celebrating.

What is All Saints' Day?

All Saints' Day is a festival on which the church remembers and honors all the Christian faithful, both known and unknown. Remembering the lives and examples of the saints had been a widespread practice of Christians since the earliest days of the church.

When is All Saints' Day celebrated?

The date for the observance of All Saints' Day is November 1st. The observance is normally transferred to the first Sunday in November.

What does the word "Saint" mean?

The English word *saint* comes from the Latin *sanctus*, which means holy.

Who are the Saints?

God declares that everyone who has been baptized and believes the promise of the Gospel is now justified, holy, and blameless. The communion of saints therefore includes both those still living on earth and those who have died in the faith.

How do Lutherans honor the Saints?

Lutherans do not pray to the saints in heaven or invoke their help as Roman Catholics do. However, we do honor the saints and thank God for the example they set for us to imitate. Notice that when we honor the saints we actually give glory to God and not to the saints themselves. It is God's undeserved grace through Jesus that makes a righteous and holy saint.

What is the liturgical color for All Saints' Day?

The color for All Saints" day is white. In the book of Revelation it says God's saints are those who have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb (Rev 7:14)

Why is All Saints' Day such a Special event in the life of the church?

We remember the faithful men and women of the Bible and praise God for their examples. In addition, Christian history is full of stories of faithful Christians, some well known (like Augustine or Luther), but the vast majority known only to God. We remember these as well. At First and Palisade – like at many other congregations – we remember those who were called to be with the Lord this past year.

An opportunity to remember your loved ones

Come to First or Palisade Lutheran on November 5th. At our worship service we will all have the opportunity to memorialize loved ones who have gone before us and are now in Christ's tender care.



October 17, 2023

The meeting was called to order by President Les Hengeveld with 7 members present and Pastor Mark.

Pastor Mark opened with a devotion.

Secretary's Report MSC to approve the secretary's report. Treasurer's Report Funds have been raised to cover Phase 1 of the Organ Renovation. First received \$50 from Walmart toward Lefse project. MSC to approve the treasurer's report. Parsonage Report MSC to approve the parsonage report. Balance is \$10,096.37

Pastor's Report - We had a good time making lefse. Pastor's hip surgery is scheduled for November 10. Chris Matson of Church on the Street will be here November 12 for the Palisades Fall Festival, and will do the church service at First as well.

Old Business:

Two downspouts have been trenched and buried. Next work day is October 21, at 10:00 am.

Plumber is still 2 weeks out to check the situation in the north bathroom. Art Aadland has contract for the organ renovation ready to sign.

New Business:

Council voted and approved a rent increase of \$100 plus another \$25 for the renters second dog. This brings the rent total to \$900 and will start in January. Property manager requires 60 day notice for the renters and requests a signed lease. First will request the renters sign a month to month lease, with no penalty for moving with less notice. Discussed updating the parsonage should these renters decide to leave. Contract with Art Aadland was approved and signed. First will participate in Christmas concert.

Next Council meeting is November 21, 2023.
